Marriage: Arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the wedding. A Pre-Cana process is required. Please contact the office.

Marriage Tribunal: Deacon Jerry is a trained Case Assistant. Petitioners may speak with him for guidance.

Baptism: Baptism is conferred on the third Saturday of every month at 11:00 am or during a regular weekend mass. Parents must be registered and participating parishioners for a minimum of three months. Parents and Godparents must attend a baptism class and submit godparent documents. In order to obtain more information or to schedule a baptism, please contact the office.

First Reconciliation/First Communion: School-aged children should enroll in our regular catechetical program. **This is a 2-year program.** Children must have attended a prior year of faith formation.

Confirmation: Children should enroll in our regular catechetical program. Confirmation preparation is a 2-year program.

***All Sacramental students are required to submit baptism certificate and long form of birth certificate.**

On September 8, 2022, the State House bill H5399, the Human Life Protection Act, was passed by: "a vote of 27-16, the S.C. Senate passed a significantly amended version of House Bill 5399: the Human Life Protection Act., negating its original purpose to eliminate most abortions in S.C., while protecting the life of the mother. The amended House Bill 5399 protects all preborn children after a physician can detect a heartbeat. The bill also amends a specific clause that came into question in a recent decision by the S.C. Supreme Court temporarily enjoining the S.C. Fetal Heartbeat Act." – "While this legislation has passed the S.C. Senate, the House must concur and accept these changes or send the legislation to a conference committee. These negotiations will require great tact and prayer." (From the South Carolina Catholic Conference.) - SC Senate bill S1373 is still in Committee. - Let us pray that one day soon every living human being created by God will be respected, cherished and protected under the law.
